Scoring Guide for the Climate Change Attitude Survey

The updated version of the CCAS has 18 items. The items created a two-factor structure that were named Climate Change Beliefs (Factor 1) and Climate Change Intentions (Factor 2). Factor 1 Climate Change Beliefs includes Items 1-8, 10 from Part 1 below and Item 1,6,7,8 from Part 2. In a recent analysis of the data, the Cronbach's alpha for the 10 items was .89. Factor 2 Climate Change Intentions has 5 items all that are negatively worded and must be reversed before scoring. (1 = 5, 2 = 4, 3 = 3, 4 = 2, 5 = 1) The items included are Item 9 from Part 1 and Items 2,3,4,5 from Part 2. The Cronbach's alpha for this factor was .76.
